## TOWN BOARD DISCUSSION RELATED TO THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION:

COUNCILWOMAN SPERR: I noticed in the documents that you provided to us that there were several changes in the healthcare issues and in the salary preparation and quite a bit of dialog in the dog control. I wondered if you could just take a few minutes and explain to us the benefits of both the changes to that.

SUPERVISOR DUNNING: The, those are the primary changes in most of the union contract, the dog control changes in that were in a MOA that was signed three years ago, two, three, four years ago. Um, so all that was, was incorporating that MOA into the, we took all the MOA's that were sitting out there and we incorporated them into the contract rather than having them sitting out there as MOA's. Changes in healthcare were basically to provide more money into people's pockets. In looking at the, we reduced the way or changed the way that we were calculating how much you contributed to the healthcare. It went from a straight dollar amount to a percentage amount, which in turn also lowered people's healthcare costs as well as we increased the contributions to the employee's HSA accounts. So that was basically what the healthcare. We are still offering the high deductible plan as the primary and if you want the core plan we certainly left that available, however you would pay more money for that option. Again, we were looking at the high deductible plan was a much better plan as a way to provide a good plan at a lower cost. The third was wages, we are at 2.25 for 2017, 3, 3, 2.75, & 2.75 for the remaining years with a reopen in 2019 for wages only for 30 days. Beginning June 1, 2019 we will open discussions for possible increase in wages.
