• **CPL-on-the-Go Update** – CPL-on-the-Go! took part in the Chili Summerfest on June 29. Staff attending the library booth gave out free books to children which were donated by the Friends of the Chili Public Library.

- **Chili Art Group Exhibit in the Library's Reading Room** There is a new exhibit of artwork by the Chili Art Group in the Library's Reading Room from September 29, 2024 January 5, 2025.
- he Library is to promote literacy and encourage the joy of reading. To that end the Library agreed to be the beneficiary of Boy Scout Charles Sutton's Eagle Scout project to build a Little Free Library in Davis Park. A Little Free Library builds community, inspires readers, and expands book access. The Little Free Library is now in place at Davis Park by the playground. The books are free to residents to take and replace, and the Friends of the Chili Public Library have agreed to make sure it is always well stocked. One of the primary purposes of the Eagle Scout service project is for the Scout to learn leadership skills, or to improve or demonstration leadership skills the Scout has already. It was the Boy Scout's recommendation to make the Little Free Library a replica of a Wells Barn.



Between 1886–1942, the Wells Family constructed over 200 barns, the majority of which were spread throughout Western New York. Fewer than fifty remain. A handful of the barns still stand in Chili, NY.

• Summer Reading Program Update – The Library has an excellent start to the Summer Reading Program! Registration began on June 24, and as of Wednesday, July 17 there were 644 kids registered. Last year there were 703 registrations by the end of August, so we are definitely on track to surpass that!

Our annual Truck Show was held on July 8. We had a record-breaking crowd this year, with 555 people in attendance! We gave out popsicles, stickers, sunglasses, free books, and copies of the winning bookmarks from this year's Bookmark Design Contest.

We have had a number of other successful programs in the last two weeks. The most surprising was our Rock Painting program, which we thought would be a relaxed, drop-in program and instead was overflowing with patrons, to the point where we saw over 100 people in the two-hour span and ran out of rocks!

So far, our July programs have garnered nearly 900 people in attendance, and we have more programs this week that already have another 145 patrons registered.

As of this week, we will be halfway through the eight weeks of the program, and we're looking forward to the next four weeks. Upcoming we have our space themed escape room, Glow in the Dark painting, international snack programs, visits from a pirate and a

mermaid, a Dinosaur Tea Party, a whole day of Tie-Dye, and more!

• Magic Treehouse Book Club – The Library created a new book club for the Summer called Magic Treehouse Book Club. It meets Wednesdays at 2pm July 10, 17, 24, 31 and August 7, 14. Best for ages 6-9, the library will read a different Magic Tree House book each week. Registration is required.

Whereas the System anticipates receiving 2024-25 Local Library Services Aid (LLSA) from the State of New York, the purpose of which is to enhance the member library's ability to provide library services to their local communities, and

Whereas the System is required to distribute these funds to System Member libraries based on a per capita formula established by the State, and

Whereas The System is required by law to distribute funds received within thirty (30) days of receipt, and

Therefore the System shall pay the Library \$8,088.30. The payment will be based on the funding level established by the New York State Education Department Division of Library Development for the 2024-25 fiscal year.

• Approval of the Chili Public Library 2024-2030 State Aid for Library Construction Grant Application for the Children's Room Door Project – The Library Director requests the Library Board approve the Chili Public Library's 2024-2030 Public Library Construction Grant Program application, to be administered in accordance with the requirements of Education Law 273-a (as Amended by Chapter 57 of the Laws of 2007) and Commissioner's Regulations 90.12, and the application was read and duly adopted by the Board of Trustees of the Chili Public Library at a legal meeting on July 23, 2024. The cost of project for which funding is being requested is \$\$7,718. The amount of Public Library Construction Funds requested in the application is \$3,859 The grant application requires the amount cannot be more than 50% or the project cost.
